

BABY CARE KITS

Flannel...yarn...sewing...knitting...warm snuggly babies---all come to mind with Baby Care Kits.

Christ Lutheran has a proud history of sending Baby Care Kits through Lutheran World Relief. Many of us connected with this project through people who were committed to helping others. Sonja, Marion, JoAnn, and Sharon were a few that took me under their wings and taught me to sew baby gowns, knit baby sweaters, and pack kits. I loved it! And I still do.

Would you like to be a part of this ongoing effort? Help takes many forms. Some sew. Some knit. Some shop garage sales and thrift stores. Some donate money or Thrivent grants for the flannel, towels, soap, sox, and pins we purchase every year. Others donate gently used knit garments such as t-shirts to be upcycled into baby shirts, pants, gowns, and diapers. Our faithful cutters, sewers, sergers and knitters perform ordinary miracles and upcycle donations into Baby Care Kits. Many, many people donate time and energy.

If you are interested in helping, consider helping to gather these items which are included in each Baby Care Kit:

- 2 large blankets (at least 36" on each side; limit 54" per side)
- 4 diapers (upcycled panels cut from t-shirts and surged or sewn together)
- 1 hand towel (or 1/3 bath towel hemmed on edges)
- 2 pajamas (gown, sleeper, 2-piece pj's all gratefully accepted (6 month to 24 month size)
- 2 shirts (6 month to 24 month size --- purchased or sewn)
- 1 sweater or jacket with hood or cap (6 month to 24 month size)
- 2 pairs sox (6 month to 24 months)
- 2 bars gentle soap (4 oz size preferred; 3 oz acceptable) suggested: Ivory or Lever
- 2 pins (diaper pin size)

Cash donations always gratefully accepted.

Dear People of Christ Lutheran Church,

"They got up and returned at once to Jerusalem. There they found the Eleven and those with them, assembled together and saying, "It is true! The Lord has risen and has appeared to Simon." Luke 24:33-34



The Women of Christ Lutheran Receive Letter from the La Crosse Area WELCA Board

GREETINGS from your Synod WELCA Board!

You are receiving this letter because your women's ministry has donated this year to the quilting and kit efforts of Lutheran World Relief.

Earlier this year every Synod WELCA Board received a \$1,000 Katie's Fund grant to support leadership development, global connections, and living theology. After much deliberation, the Board decided to support congregational WELCA units who have given of their time and talents to Lutheran World Relief.

In 2023, 29 La Crosse Area WELCA units have contributed 2,317 quilts, 1,718 personal care kits, 1,966 school kits, 1,074 baby kits, and 79 sewing kits that are being distributed to needy persons around the globe. In appreciation of your efforts and in recognition of your continuing commitment to these projects, the Board voted unanimously to divide the money equally among the 29 units so this work may continue.

Enclosed you should find a check for \$34. Though the amount may not be huge, as one of the Board members stated, "it's \$34 more for each quilting group (or other ministry) than they currently have, and if your group is like mine, they are a FRUGAL, THRIFTY bunch." More importantly, it acknowledges the passion with which these donations are given, and is our way of saying: Good job! Keep doing the good work!


