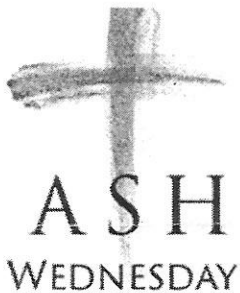

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

As we enter March, we enter the season of Lent, a time of reflection, renewal, preparation and repentance. It begins with Ash Wednesday (March 5th), a day that humbles us before God and reminds us of our mortality and need for God's mercy and grace. Throughout these forty days at Christ Lutheran Church, we will have opportunities to connect with our Lord through prayers, listen to God's Word, sing hymns, do Holden Evening Prayer, soup and sandwiches and fellowship with each other.

Again, as you know, Ash Wednesday marks the start of our Lenten journey. It is a day of humility, symbolized by the imposition of ashes. As we receive the ashes, we hear the words, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." This moment calls us to recognize our human imperfections and our deep need for God's mercy, grace, love and forgiveness.

During the Mid-Week Wednesday Lenten Services, which starts at 7 pm., we will focus on Jesus' "I AM" statements in the Gospel of John. The Soup and Sandwich begins at 5:30pm.

I AM the Bread of Life (John 6:35)-March 12th, 2025.

I AM the Light of the World (John 8:12)-March 19th, 2025.

I AM the Good Shepherd (John 10:11)-March 26th, 2025.

I AM the Way, the Truth, and the Life (John 14:6)-April 2nd, 2025.

I AM the True Vine (John 15:1)-April 9th, 2025.

Palm/Passion Sunday-April 13th, 2025; Maundy Thursday-April 17th, 2025; Good Friday-April 18th, 2025; Easter Sunday-April 20th, 2025. The North Conference Area Pastors will gather here at Christ Lutheran Church on Tuesday, March 25th, 2025, beginning at 9 am and ending at 12 pm.

Lent is a time for deep reflection and renewal. It invites us to examine our hearts and seek a closer relationship with God. Let us allow God's words to transform our lives and draw us nearer to Him.

Let us pray, support and encourage one another, and share our reflections. Through prayer, fellowship, and acts of service, we strengthen our unity in Christ and build each other up. As we journey through Lent, our hearts are filled with anticipation for the joy of Easter.

May God continue to bless you and your family in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Amen.

ELCA Disaster Relief / California Wildfires

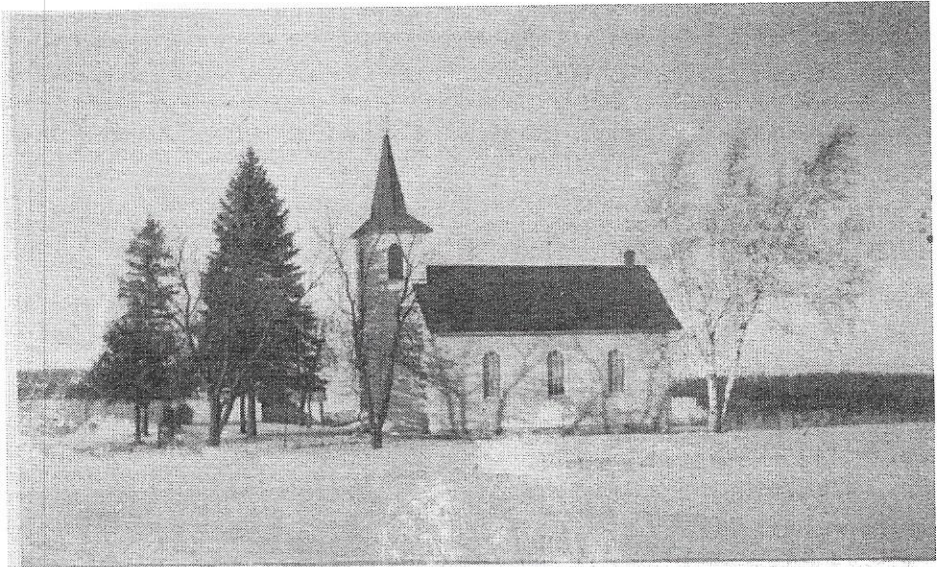

I Love to Tell the Story

Honoring the Past . . . Celebrating 150 Years 1875—2025

The following words are from a **1945 speech written by Rev. Muedeking** to celebrate the 70th anniversary of Christ Church in the Montana Township of Buffalo County:

May I, on this 70th anniversary of this congregation, give you a brief, but very incomplete record as it appears on the church book of the congregation.

The records show that the Christ congregation was organized on **March 13th 1875**. On that date the constitution was adopted. It was signed by not less than fourteen members. The names of the respective charter members were: Henry Wiemer, Fred Dorn, Henry Hertzfeldt, Carl Koenig, Henry Pape, Carl Hansow, Ludwig Pape, John Hertzfeldt, John Scharlau, Fred Scharlau, Carl Schorbahn, John Harm, Carl Ewert, and Rosmos Karasch.

No records have been kept of when this church was built, nor the date on which it was dedicated. Some of the older members seem to think that it was on the 10th of October 1885, which would be ten years after the constitution of the congregation was adopted. Whether or not this is correct cannot be verified.

The first baby baptized, according to the records, was Barbara Elizabeth Stamm, who was born on January 25th 1875 and baptized on March 29th of that same year. During the year of 1875, six babies were baptized, namely Barbara Stamm, Ida Wiemer, Henry Martin, Barbara Pape, Carl Pape and John Hertzfeldt.

The first couple to be married was Mr. and Mrs.(Alvina Winkel) John Scharlau, who were married on December 23, 1875.

The first funeral of which there is a record was Mr. Carl Hertzfeldt, who died on April 6, 1875, and was buried on April 9th.

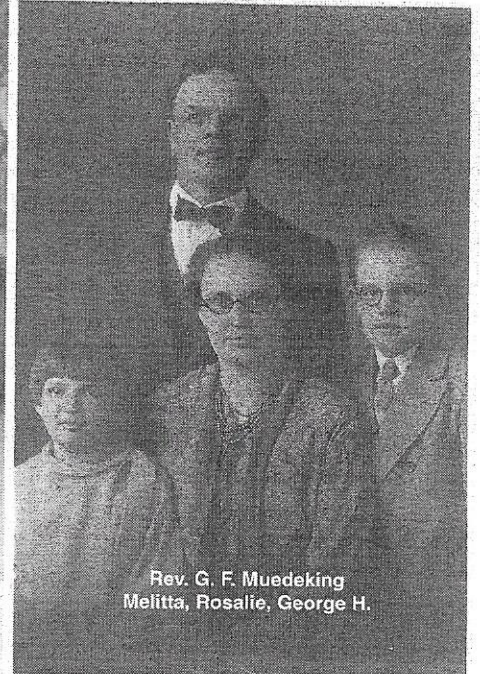
From 1863 to 1913, there were 13 pastors who served this congregation. And now your present pastor was installed on the 2nd of February 1913 and now has served this congregation for thirty-two years.

Pastor Zumhingst served 1907-13.

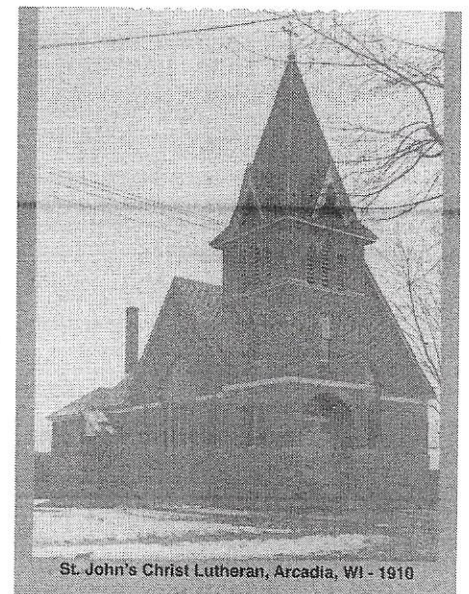

In the year 1910, the members of the St. John's congregation of Glencoe and the members of the Christ congregation of the Town Montana erected the St. John's-Christ Church in Arcadia, Wis., which was owned jointly by the two above mentioned congregations. However, in the year 1929, it was deemed advisable by all members concerned that a congregation be organized in Arcadia, and that all property belonging to the St. John's Church of Glencoe and the Christ Church of Montana be deeded over to the St. John's-Christ Church congregation in Arcadia, which at the present is composed of 206 families (close to 500 communicants).

The St. John's-Christ congregation is a member of the American Lutheran Church and for the last three years in succession has raised its full quota for missions and Lutheran World Action, and other benevolences of the A.L.C.

May God lay His richest blessings upon this congregation and all its members that they may further the promotion of His kingdom here on earth.

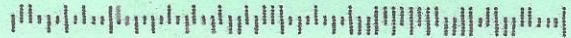
