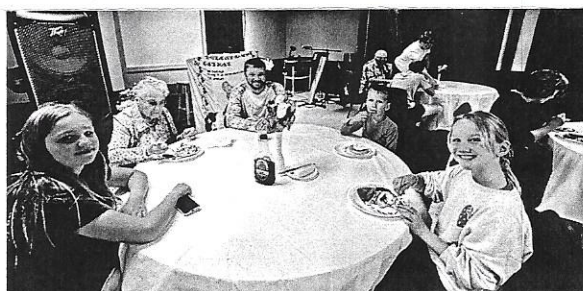

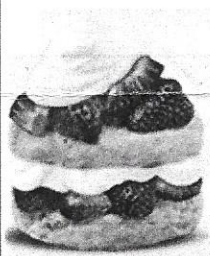

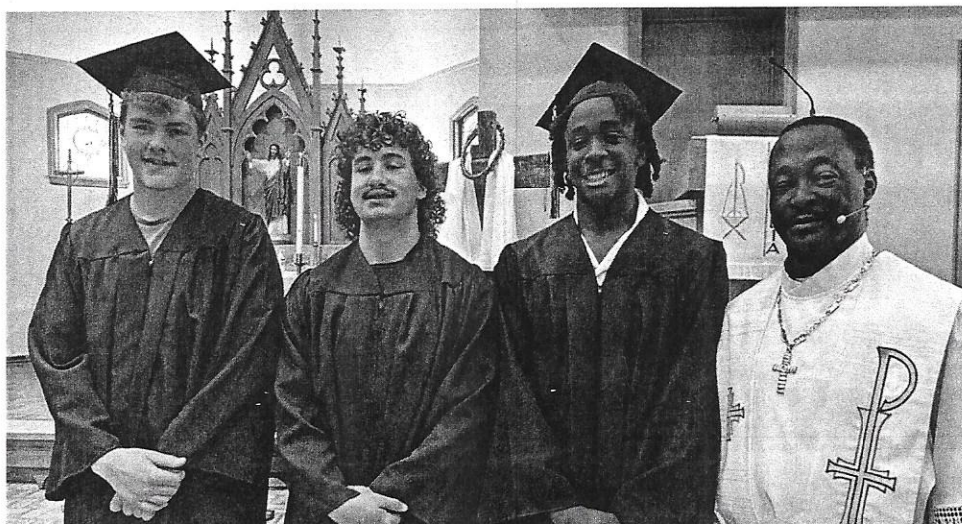

I Love to Tell the Story

Honoring the Past . . . Celebrating 150 Years 1875—2025

Sunday School Picnics...

The Sunday School Picnic, sometimes called Children's Day was held on the Schreiber Farm on Glencoe Ridge. The large shaded lawn was the setting for church services, complete with organ music. In the early years there was a children's program. A refreshment stand was available, in addition to the big noon meal served in the hay barn by the ladies. The gentlemen pitched horseshoes and played ball and other games. Otto Hohman would use his city band wagon, pulled by horses, to take folks to the picnic. This took much time but was enjoyed by all. Many folks from the surrounding area joined in for a day of fellowship. The picnic tradition started around 1915 and continued into the late 1930s.

The above information was taken from the booklet honoring our 100th anniversary in 1975.

Darlene Boberg remembers going to some picnics at the Schreiber farm. She said the kids played games and received participation ribbons. Through her volunteer work at the Arcadia Historical Society, she found some of the ribbons that may have come from our Arcadia/Montana/Glencoe Sunday School picnics or from St. John's in Arcadia picnics.

Searching through old Winona newspapers, I found many mentions of the annual picnic such as this one:

A large crowd attended the picnic held at Schreiber's grove given by the Sunday school of the **St. John's Christ Lutheran church** of Arcadia.

Winona Republican-Herald 4 June 1929

The earliest newspaper mention that I found was this one:

The German Lutheran congregation of Arcadia and Glencoe held their annual picnic at the Schreiber farm grounds on last Sunday. A tremendous crowd turned out to take part in the day's festivities.

Winona Republican-Herald, 3 July 1916

It appears that they sometimes had bands at the picnic:

St. John's Christ church will hold its annual Sunday school **picnic** Sunday, June 14,, at the **Schreiber** grove. The German band will furnish the music.

Winona Republican Herald 6 June 1936

The annual Sunday school picnic of St. John's Christ church of Arcadia was held Sunday in the grove on the Herman Schreiber farm. The Arcadia band furnished the music and a large crowd attended.

Winona Republican Herald 25 July 1923

Here is another interesting mention of music for the picnic:

ARCADIA John Krumholz—All band members will meet at the high school Sunday for the **Lutheran church picnic**. Band trousers will not be worn for the **picnic**.
Winona Republican Herald 5 June 1940

After the late 30s or early 40s, the Sunday School picnics were held in other locations.

The **St. John's Christ Lutheran church** Sunday school will hold its annual picnic at the **golf grounds** Sunday. Dinner will be served and the Arcadia High school band will furnish music. **The public is invited.**

Winona Republican-Herald 8 June 1942

ST. JOHN'S PICNIC ARCADIA, Wis. (Special) — St John's American **Lutheran Church, Arcadia**, will hold its annual Sunday School **picnic** at the **Arcadia City Park** Sunday. There will be a potluck dinner, games and contests.

Winona Daily News 26 June 1954

I remember going to several Sunday School picnics held at the Arcadia Deer Park in the early 1950s. The highlight for me was getting Glanzer's ice cream and soda pop. (It was made in downtown Arcadia on the corner of Main and Jackson Streets. Through the front window you could watch the Orange Crush pop being bottled!)

ARCADIA, Wis. (Special) - The Sunday School and congregation of the American Lutheran Church will hold their annual picnic June 13 at 11 a.m. at the Deer Park. Persons are to bring their own plates, cups and silverware for the potluck dinner. In case of rain, the picnic will be held in the church basement. Vacation Bible school will begin Monday. Children 4-years old through seventh grade may attend. Those planning to attend confirmation classes in the fall are required to attend. The school program will be presented June 13 at 9:30 am. at the second service.

Winona Daily News 28 May 1965

The 1965 picnic in the Deer Park was likely the last one I attended, as a student, since that would have been my last year of Sunday School and the year of my H.S. graduation.

How many more Sunday School/Congregational picnics have we had? I think I remember one held at Pietrek Park when our children were in Sunday School. In recent years we have had some small picnic gatherings in our church parking lot. What church picnic memories do you have?

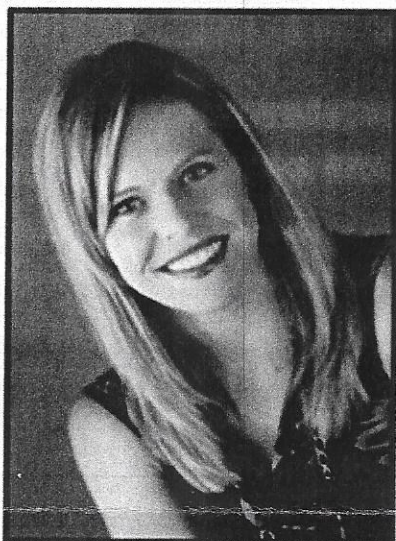
Picnics are fun. Maybe it's time to revive the annual event and invite the public like we did in 1942.

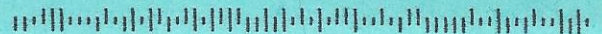
